



TOPIC 2: Rallies

- The backbone of Pony Club
- Usually held once a month throughout the year
- Coaching is centred around the PCA Syllabus of Instruction



Rallies

There are 4 main components to a rally:

- Flatwork
- Jumping
- Active Riding
- Horse Care/Theory



 Riders under 18 years of age must have an adult present for all of the rally.

Uniforms

• Most Clubs have a rally uniform (long sleeved polo type shirt).

Also used on X-Country.

- Formal uniform:
 - Club jumper
 - Shirt and Tie
 Normally worn for competitions and Certificate testing



TOPIC 3: Certificates & Competitions

- Riders are coached and examined under the PCA Syllabus of Instruction revised Dec 2020
- You can download a copy from the PCA website
- In addition riders (& parents)
 can enrol on the PCA Academy.
 This is a FREE on-line interactive
 learning program.


More on Certificates

- Club coaches can examine
 E to D* candidates
- Examiners at C and above are appointed by SCP
- Rider Manuals from
 E to B can be purchased
 from PCA



Cortificato

The Pony Club Australia Syllabus of Instruction is built on certificate levels that enable the rider to continuously develop their skills in riding, horse care and citizenship. Members are encouraged to move through the certificates at their own pace, but in the following order



- . The E Certificate is optional, but recommended.
- The D, D*, C and B Certificates are pre-requisites for the following certificates.
- The C Certificate is recommended as the baseline for all members and will ensure that the rider
 has a good foundation of skill, safety and horsemanship.
- . Candidates can progress from C to B via either the C* or the K Certificate.

Horse Welfare

- This was always a Pony Club goal
- With the 2020
 Syllabus it has been given extra impetus
- We love our horses and now have a better understanding of what they love/value.



State Competitions

These include:

- Active Riding (games)
- Dressage
- Show Jumping
- Eventing
- Tetrathlon

Riders need 3 rallies to qualify for State Competitions

Topic 4: Volunteer Pathways

Pony Club can be the start of a new volunteer career pathway.

Options include:

- Committee roles
- Coaching
- Gear Checking
- Officiating.

There is support available to help you gain the skills and knowledge for these roles.





Coaching

- Coaches are encouraged to formalise their skills and experience by gaining an NCAS qualification
- However not everyone has the time to do this.
