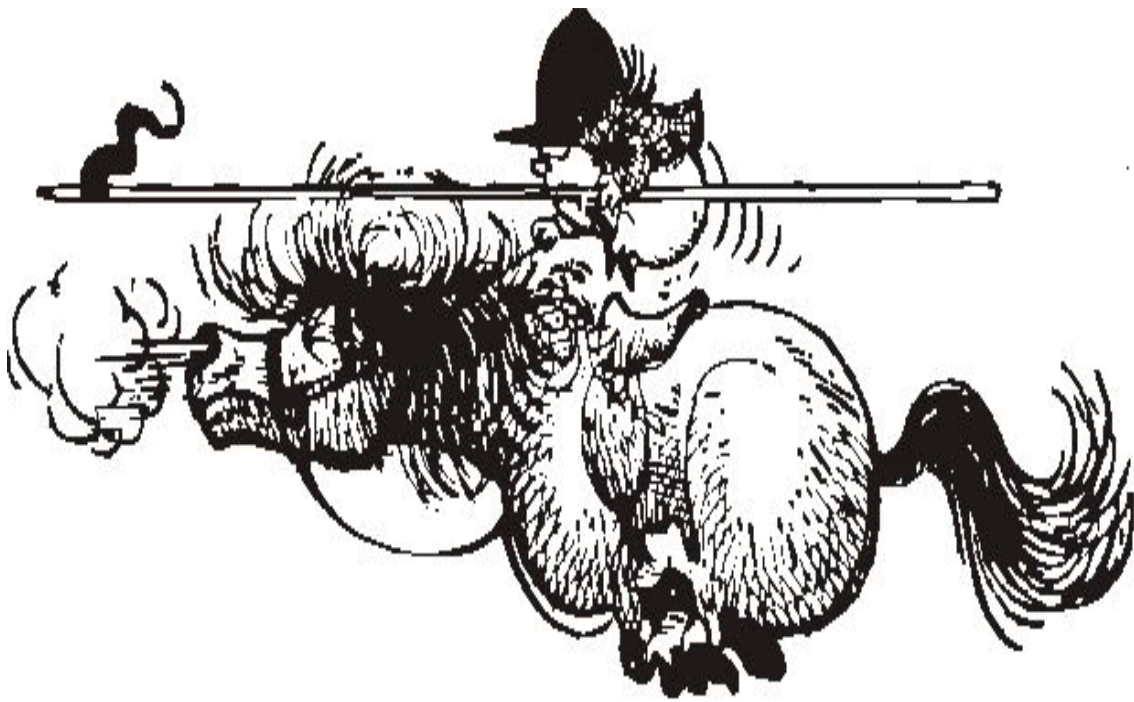
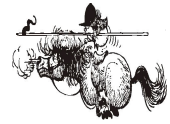

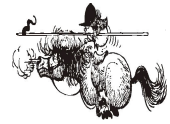

Welcome to Orange Grove Horse & Pony Club

This Handbook provides an outline of Orange Grove Horse & Pony Club (OGHPC) and also the Aims & Objectives of the Pony Club Association of Western Australia. It is intended as a guide only and is to be read in conjunction with the OGHPC constitution ([linked to website](#)). If you require further information, or have any queries, please speak to one of our committee members.

The Pony Club movement came into being in England in 1929 to encourage young people in their riding. Due to the popularity of this activity, it is now represented in the no less than 25 countries. In Western Australia the first Pony Club was formed in 1959. All clubs are affiliated with the Pony Club Association of Western Australia (PCAWA). OGHPC became affiliated with PCAWA in 1971.

Western Australian Pony Clubs are divided into 13 Zones: Avon, Central, Eastern, Great Southern, Hills, Metropolitan, Midlands, Northern, North West, South Eastern, South West, West Coastal & the newly formed Swan Zone. OGHPC is a part of the Metropolitan Zone.

In 1974 Ken Foster was the 1st member of our Pony Club to be awarded a "Shell Award" now known as Vetsearch International Citizenship Award. This is the highest award to be given in the Pony Club Association. It is given out for outstanding service to your Pony Club. Other recipients from our club to receive this award are; - Patricia Cox 1975, Danny Broughton 1976, Greg Johnston 1977, Julie Platt 1978, Richelle McKean 1987, Tanya Gallon 1989, Mathew Hemy 1990, Shane Newling 1993, Maryanne Payne 1998 and Meagan Taylor 2008.



Clayton Fredericks, who is regarded as one of the world's leading event riders was a member at Orange Grove for 8 years in the late 1970's. Clayton is now based in England and has represented Australia at both the Olympic Games and the World Equestrian Games in the discipline of eventing.

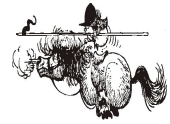

The Rally

OGHPC holds one rally per month, from March to November, usually the 2nd Sunday of the month. We cater for all levels of riders, from lead rein through to experienced members.

Our Formal part of the rally is held between 08:00 – 12:30, starting with a meeting in the clubhouse. Then each rally group has 3 lessons per rally, 2 mounted lessons & 1 theory. This is known as the 'working rally'.

Each rally lesson is constructed around the Pony Club Syllabus & riders are encouraged (although it is not compulsory) to do their certificates. Riders also are required to complete a log book, & bring it with them to each rally.

We continue in the afternoon with mounted activities for practice & fun, but are not compulsory to attend. This time is usually used for team training for PCAWA State events.

Rally Attendance Recordings

As from January 2012 PCAWA no longer requires affiliated Pony Club's to fill out member rally attendances on membership cards. OGHPC is required to keep its own records of member attendances at working rallies throughout the year. A member may attend another clubs rally, but must request this with the Rally coordinator from Orange Grove, prior to attending.

Members that are transferring to another club can provide copies of club attendance register as proof of rallies attendance.

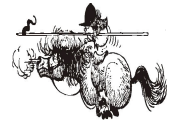
Where the Chief Instructor is signing off rally attendance please note that the horse and rider must be present at that working rally for a minimum of 4 hours.

To be eligible to enter PCAWA & Zone held events, the horse/ rider combination **MUST** have attended 3 working rallies, in the previous 12 months, two of which must have been at the club they are representing. A maximum of 2 horses/ponies may be ridden at a working rally and the rider must participate in at least one ridden session on each horse.

Unmounted rallies do not qualify as a working rally.

Our Coaches

At Orange Grove we have a dedicated group of coaches. The majority of coaches are parents of current members, or past members that have returned to pass on their knowledge. All our coaches are aware of & are working through the PCAWA syllabus during the lessons. **Please remember pony club is a youth movement & not a riding school**, we are there to encourage young people to ride and learn to enjoy all approved kinds of sport connected with horses and riding, and to instil in members the proper care of their animals.



Our Lessons

A compulsory gear check of horse & rider prior to mounting is conducted at the first mounted lesson, a parent or guardian should be in attendance if their child is under 18 years of age. Safety & cleanliness of gear of both horse & rider will be assessed and points awarded. Refer below what uniform riders are required to wear at rallies.

Riders must dismount & walk between lessons & in car park, unless otherwise instructed.

Courtesy & consideration should be shown to Instructors and other riders at ALL times. If late for a class, apologise & ask the instructor if you may join in, if you wish to leave a class early, request permission from the instructor.

The Pony Club, through its activities & the manner in which they are run, sets the example of sportsmanship & citizenship to its members. Lessons provide young riders up to C* level encouragement & instruction to complete certificates. During the last few years of their membership & hopefully after, we encourage older members to put something back into the club in a voluntary capacity.

Uniforms

It is OGHPC's policy that the OGHPC uniform be worn at all times, at all events including training days. OGHPC colours are Green & Gold.

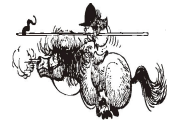

We also offer a range of accessories, such as saddle blankets, jackets & helmet covers. Uniforms are available for purchase throughout the year.



Membership

Membership at OGHPC is currently capped at 70 members & also depends on spaces within each available group. Current members are given the opportunity to rejoin the club at the end of each season, before new memberships are accepted.

At OGHPC we limit group size to eight & under, to allow each member better instruction. We also group members according to certificates achieved as well as member's age, mount type & riding ability.

For current membership fees, please refer to the respective year membership pack on the club's website.

Membership **MUST** be paid at time of enrolment.

Insurance

All riding members under the age of 18 years are not to be left at the club unattended. This is a PCAWA ruling. The club allows temporary guardianship of another, if both parties sign a written authorisation. The Temporary Guardianship Form can be found on OGHPC website (www.oghpc.org). Only current guardians that are listed on the strength return can be temporary guardians of another guardian's child.

Members keen to obtain certificates, should ensure that they collect any theory sheets from any missed rallies, as all subjects covered at rallies will be included in exams.

Canteen

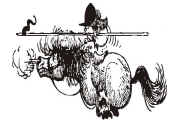
OGHPC is fortunate to have a well run canteen that can provide members with delicious low cost menu. All profits raised from our canteen go straight back into supporting our club. The canteen management is always grateful to have helpers assist at all our events.

Log Books

Pony club encourages members to complete a logbook. The logbook is usually a loose fitting ring file and contains a brief account of the rider's history, horses ridden history and any other information regarding horses. Suggested log book layout will be given to members at the first rally during their theory lesson.

The riders are asked to present their logbook every rally to be marked. The marks go towards a trophy at the end of the year. Riders are asked to put all new information in the front of the file for marking. Any items that are given to them at the rally can also be put into the logbook.

The logbooks are to be placed on the table in the clubrooms. Before the rider takes the logbook they should check to see that it has been marked. There will be a sheet placed in the front of the logbook



for marking which the person marking it will sign. Both good things and bad things can be written in the logbooks. The logbooks are a great reference for the children to look back on later.

Rosters

All members are required to do a minimum of 5 rosters during the year. These rosters are to help the club to keep running smoothly.

The contact details for the Roster Co-ordinator can be found on the clubs website.

For our club to be able to afford to purchase or replace equipment, and to keep our joining fee to a minimum we need to continually run events to raise much needed funds. We are very fortunate to have a dedicated group of people willing to give up their time to organise such events, but we can't do it without you, our members. So please help by volunteering to do these rosters willingly.

Remember that if you do not complete 5 rosters then you may forfeit membership renewal & will not be eligible for trophies.

Rosters at events can include (but not limited to) jobs like pencilling, gear checking, marshalling, canteen duty, arena party, organising desk (registrations) setting up the day prior to the event, pack away and even assisting with the actual organisation of the day.

Please make sure you complete your nomination for a roster on our chart provided at all Rallies. Updated listed of duty rosters for events will be maintained of the OGHPC website. Please check regularly for updates.

Note set up & pack up at rallies, do not count as rosters. All participating members are to help with these duties.

PCAWA State Championship Team Selections

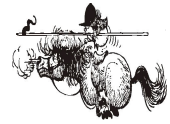
OGHPC is well represented in all State Championships held by PCAWA. Team selections always prove to be difficult & the Chief Instructor at the time normally decides how the selection process will work. The committee has agreed that coaches will be provided with 100% support on the final decisions.

State Championships held by PCAWA include;

- Tetrathlon- comprising of shooting, swimming, running and riding a cross country course;
- Showjumping;
- Dressage;
- Eventing;
- PPMG; and
- Novelties

PCAWA also holds a Festival every two years where club members can represent the club.



The Metropolitan Zone also holds events throughout the year where members can represent the club. These include a Show Jumping Fun Day, Gymkhana, Quadrathon and a Novelty Selection Day.

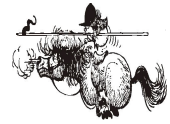
Nominations open to all Committee and Financial Members of OGHPC. Nominations are self-nominations. Nominations to be collated and presented to Committee for overall approval at the March Meeting. Tetrathalon Sub-Committee would need to be nominated for Oct and presented at November Meeting. All other Sub-Committees can be done in Feb/March.

Sub – Committee

- Responsible for meeting as deemed appropriate prior to Event.
- Responsible for articulating guidelines for selection in consultation with committee as required.
- Responsible for voting and participating in discussions and selections in the best interests of the club.
- Responsible for completing duties as volunteered or delegated.
- Appoint a Chair.

Chair responsible for completion or delegation of following duties:

- Entry Pack Completion;
- Prior to Entries Closing, submit teams to committee for ratifying. In the event that no committee meeting is held, Chair can request a meeting with CI & Coach to ratify selections;
- Collection of Money for entries and submission to Treasurer prior to Event;
- Collection of Money for coaches gift as deemed appropriate by the Sub Committee;
- Arrangement of Training Sessions and communication to Club Members;
- Presentation Arrangements for Teams i.e. Dress Code/Horse Attire, etc;
- Helper Rosters for the Event;
- Event Arrangements – i.e. Camping, Dinners;
- Responsible for arranging meetings and communication to sub-committee and then overall Committee at Monthly meeting; and



- To advise members when Metro Zone run offs for Champ Events are on and if OGH & PC are required to host run off etc assist with arrangements as requested by Metro Zone.

Chief Coach to assist/oversee as required.

Closed Gymkhanas

OGHPC holds closed gymkhanas that members only are entitled to attend. Members must wear either the OGHPC formal uniform or hacking attire is acceptable. Horse & ponies must be neatly turnout, but plaiting is optional.

Trophy Rules

The OGHPC rules for trophy qualifications are as follows:

- Riders must attend a minimum of 50% of Rallies/ Gymkhanas as rider/horse combination to qualify for the trophy.
- Riders must be financial members of the OGHPC.
- The Horses Current measuring certificate must be produced & recorded in the OGHPC Height Register book each year.
- Riders must have completed FIVE (5) rosters for the club each year.
- You may look at your own points at any time during the year.

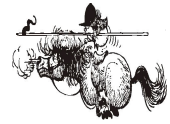

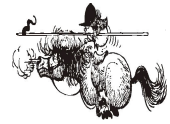

Eligibility Criteria:

- Awarded from results of Closed Gymkhana's. The OGHPC's preferred number of Closed Gymkhana's to hold over a calendar year is three (calendar permitting). These Gymkhanas are open to OGHPC Members only and points will be awarded as follows for each class/event:
 - 1st 3 pts
 - 2nd 2pts
 - 3rd 1 pt



- Points will accumulate from the total number of Gymkhana's you attend. Points will accumulate as a Horse, Pony/Rider combination. There is no minimum attendance to be eligible for these trophies.
- Age for trophies is in line with PCAWA as at 1st January Calendar Year (i.e. for every event you will ride in the age group you were as at 1st January).
- **Hacking:**
 - There will be a minimum of 3 Hack Classes that will score points to Height Hack Trophy.
 - If you win points in leadline or first ridden and progress up to hack ring your points will go with you. If you need to return to leadline/first ridden and you have scored points in the hack ring you will be ineligible to score points in the leadline/first ridden classes.
 - All classes will score points for either Rider Trophy or Hack Trophy.
- **Jumping:**
 - There will be a minimum of 2 height classes per Gymkhana. You can only jump one height per day. No HC will be available. If you move up a height your points will move with you. If you need to come down a height and you have scored points at the higher height you will ineligible to score points at the lower height.
- **Novelties:**
 - Minimum of 3 Age Races each Gymkhana.
- **Dressage:**
 - Limited Tests dependent upon the Judge. Prep, Prelim & Novice Test available for each Gymkhana. First nominated when nominations called for in.
- **Highest Points Overall Trophy:**
 - To be eligible an OGHPC member/horse, pony combination must have achieved a minimum of 1 point in each phase of Hacking, Jumping, Novelties and Dressage and then the member with the highest overall points wins. Website

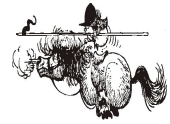

Minimum age for Candidates undertaking tests, and Certificate colours

- D Standard 7 years Yellow
- D*Standard 9 years Lime green
- C Standard 12 years Green
- K Standard 14 years Purple
- C* Standard 14 years Pink
- B Standard 16 years Red
- H Standard 17 years Orange
- A Standard 17 years Blue

PRE-REQUISITES:

Standards D, C, C*or K, B, and A, must be gained in that order, i.e. each is a pre-requisite for the higher standard. There is no pre-requisite for the H Certificate.

Exams

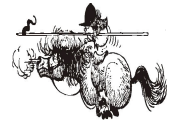
Certificates D & D* are examined within the club, by an experienced instructor.

C Certificate is examined by a PCAWA C examiner, who is coordinated by the clubs CI. No more than 6 candidates can be examined at the same time.

C* candidates are assessed for suitability by the C*/K coordinator within their clubs zone, & must pass the ridden & lunging assessment before they are to be examined.

B & above are coached & schooled at a State level & must attend clinics & schools conducted by PCAWA, prior to be examined.

Please note that Formal Pony Club Uniform is to be worn when being examined for certificates.



Code of Conduct

Members should be aware of the **Aims and Objectives of Pony Club:**

- To encourage young people to ride and learn to enjoy all approved kinds of sport connected with horses and riding.
- To provide instruction in riding, horsemastership and to instil in members the proper care of their animals.
- To promote the highest ideals of fellowship, citizenship and loyalty and to cultivate strength of character and self-discipline.

Members should be aware Pony Club is a Youth movement and has always maintained a high standard of behaviour and presentation.

Members should be aware if they are representing the OGHPC in any shape or form, whether it is Club, Zone, State or Country, that it is expected that their behaviour would never compromise, bring into disrepute or embarrass themselves, their Club, Zone or State Pony Club Association.

Members should be proud of their involvement in the Pony Club movement and in their uniform.

Care of the Horse

In all equestrian sports, the horse must be considered paramount.

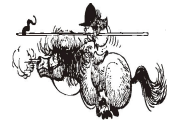
The well being of the horse shall be above the demands of riders, coaches, owners, officials, organisers or sponsors.

In the interest of the horse, the fitness and competence of the rider shall be regarded as essential.

Riders Code of Behaviour

Ride by the rules.

- Never argue with an official. If you disagree, have your Captain, Coach or Manager; approach the official during a break or after the competition.
- Control your temper. Verbal abuse of officials and sledging other riders, deliberately distracting or provoking an opponent are not acceptable or permitted behaviours in any sport.
- Work equally hard for yourself and/or your team. Your team's performance will benefit; so will you.
- Be a good sport. Applaud all good efforts whether they are by your team or the other competitors.
- Treat all riders, as you would like to be treated. Do not interfere with, bully or take unfair advantage of another rider.
- Cooperate with your coach, team mates and opponents. Without them there would be no competition. Ride for the 'fun of it' and not just to please parents and coaches. Respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background or religion.



Parent / Guardian Code of Behaviour

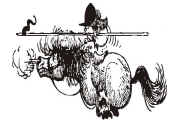
- Remember that children participate in sport for their enjoyment.
- Encourage children to participate, do not force them.
- Focus on the rider's efforts and performance rather than winning or losing.
- Encourage children always to play according to the rules and settle disagreements without resorting to hostility or violence.
- Never ridicule or yell at a child for making a mistake or losing a competition.
- Remember that children learn best by example. Appreciate good performances and skilful plays by all participants.
- Support all efforts to remove verbal and physical abuse from sporting activities.
- Respect officials' decisions and teach children to do likewise.
- Show appreciation for volunteer coaches, officials and administrators. Without them your child could not participate.
- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of every young person regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background or religion.

Spectators Code of Behaviour

- Respect the decisions of officials and teach young people to do the same.
- Never ridicule or scold a young rider for making a mistake. Positive comments are motivational.
- Condemn the use of violence in any form, whether it is by other spectators, coaches, officials or riders.
- Show respect for your team's opponents. Without them, there would be no competition.
- Do not use violence, harassment or abuse in any form (that is, do not use foul language, sledge or harass riders, coaches, officials or other spectators).
- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of every person regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background or religion.

Other Rules of Orange Grove Horse & Pony Club

- Neither the club nor its members nor any person acting on its behalf shall be held responsible for any accident, damage, injury or loss at gymkhanas, meetings, rallies or other events to spectators, horses, persons or property.
- Spectators must keep clear of the field and horse marshalling yards to prevent accidents.
- Riders must keep horses away from parking areas and club house.
- If in the opinion of the Committee any horse is not in a sound and fit condition it may be ordered from the ground.
- Mares with foal at foot – Foals must wear a halter and be attended at all times whilst on the grounds.



- Stallions and rigs are not permitted on the ground except with special permission from the Committee.
- No rider will be permitted to ride on the grounds unless he or she is wearing approved head gear, suitable footwear, jodhpurs and a long sleeved shirt.
- If in the opinion of the Committee any person is guilty of mis-treating a horse on the grounds at any time, then that person may be ordered from the grounds.
- No item of apparel or equipment is to be used which in the opinion of the Committee likely to cause injury to the horse or rider.
- Riders entering any event must abide by the clubs rules and obey instructions of the ground stewards or be disqualified.
- No dogs are allowed on the grounds unless on a leash.
- No dogs are allowed in the club house.
- No fires are to be lit on the grounds without permission of the President or other authorised persons.
- Litter must be placed in the litter bins provided.
- The Committee reserves the right to refuse permission for any horse or rider to compete at any Club event.
- No rider may use the Club grounds or its equipment except on Club days or with the express approval of the President in writing.
- The gear to be used by riders and their mounts shall comply with the rulings made by the Council of PCAWA from time to time.
- Alcohol may not be brought onto or consumed on the Club's premises on Club rally days or any other competitive event conducted or hosted by the club.
- Members who are found to be using illegal drugs on the Club's premises or affected by such drugs at any Club rally or activity shall either be suspended or expelled at the discretion of the Management Committee.
- The use of drugs (on horses) prohibited by EWA including sedatives (calming drugs) is not permitted at any Club activity.



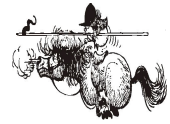
PCAWA Gear Checking Matrix
